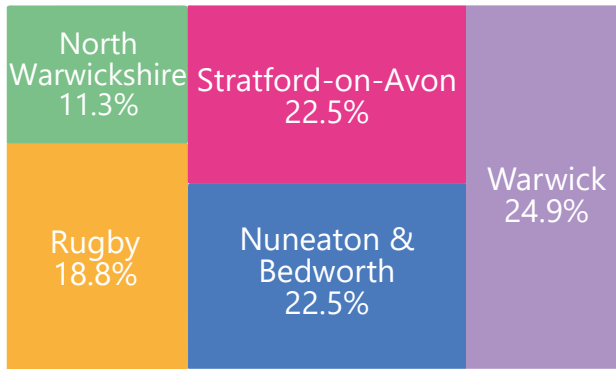


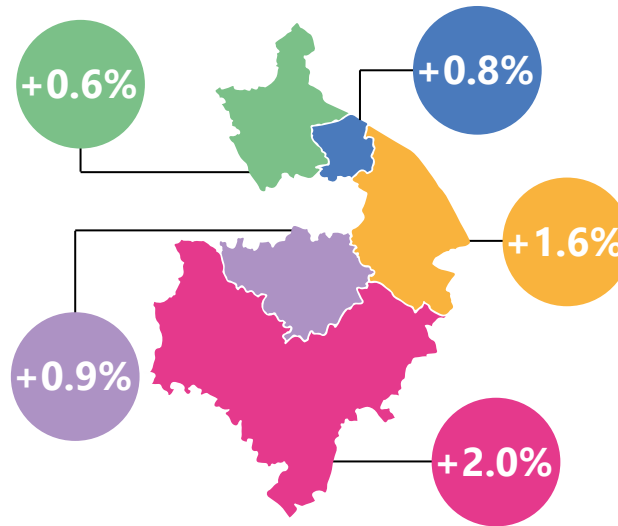


The 2019 mid-year estimates indicate Warwickshire is now home to **577,933** people...

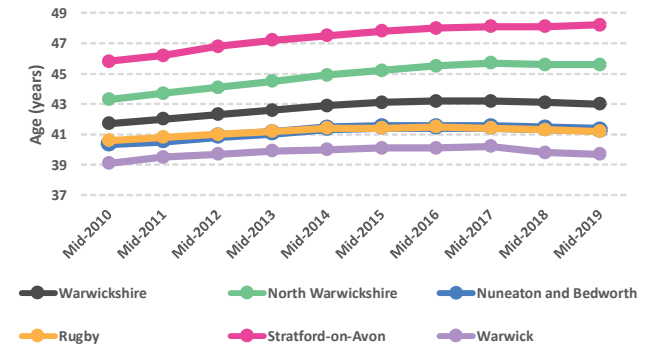


increasing by **6,923** people or **1.2%** from the previous year. Almost one **quarter** of residents live in **Warwick District**

The median age of a Warwickshire resident is **43.0 years** - up from 41.7 years in 2010



In 2019 Stratford-on-Avon District had the highest median age (**48.2 yrs**) while Warwick District had the lowest (**39.7 yrs**)



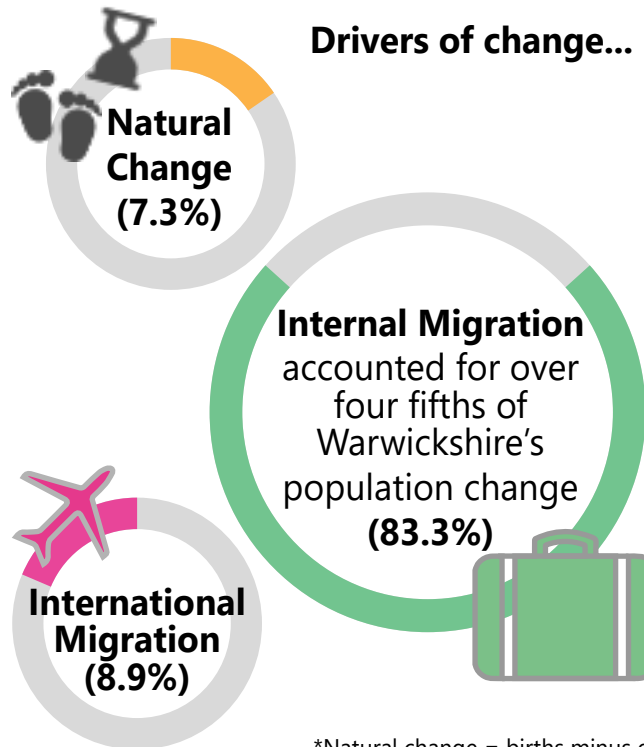
Around **20%** of Warwickshire residents are **young people** (aged between 0-17)

Around **59%** of Warwickshire residents are of **working age** (aged between 18-64)

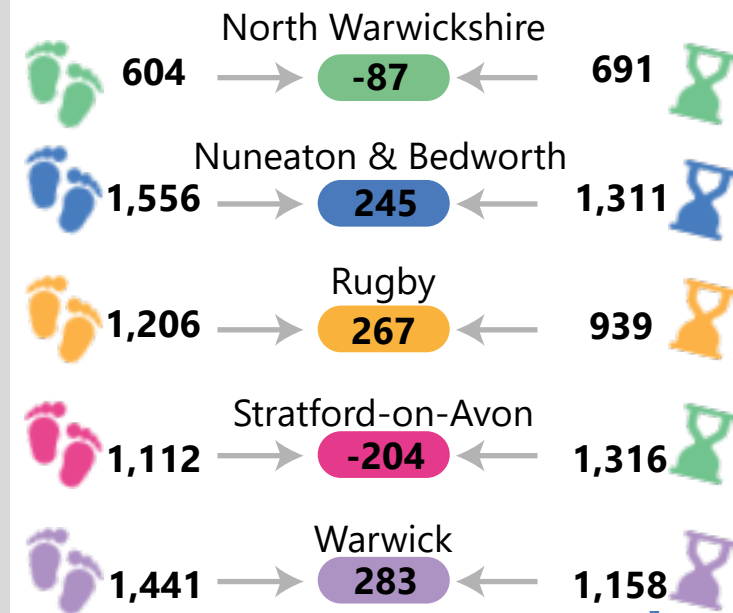


Around **21%** of Warwickshire residents are **older people** (aged 65+). Almost 6% are aged 80+

### Summary

These are the official revised population estimates for the UK as at 30 June 2019. They are based on the Census and are updated annually to account for population change during the period from 1 July to 30 June.

Mid-year population estimates relate to the usually resident population. They account for long-term international migrants (people who change their country of usual residence for a period of 12 months or more) but do not account for short-term migrants (people who come to or leave the country for a period of less than 12 months).

The mid-year population estimates are used directly as a base for other secondary population statistics, such as population projections, population estimates of the very old and population estimates for small geographical areas.

The mid-year population estimates are an important input for a wide number of economic and social statistics. Main users include central and local government and the health sector, where they are used for planning and monitoring service delivery, resource allocation and managing the economy as well as being of interest to the general public.

### Key Facts – Warwickshire

- Between mid 2018 and mid 2019, **the population of Warwickshire increased by 1.2%** - marginally higher than the previous year (1.1%). This compares to growth of 0.5% in the UK.
- **All districts and boroughs experienced increases in population above the national average.** The highest rates were in Stratford-on-Avon (2.0%) and Rugby (1.6%) followed by Warwick (0.9%), Nuneaton & Bedworth (0.8%) and North Warwickshire (0.6%).
- **The proportion of the population aged 65+ is higher in Warwickshire (20.8%) compared to the UK (18.5%).** Just over 1 in 5 of the population in Stratford-on-Avon is aged 65+.
- **Median age in Warwickshire has increased from 41.7 years in 2010 to 43.0 years in 2019.** The county ranks 42nd out of 151 upper tier local authorities for median age of residents.
- There were **5,919 births in Warwickshire between mid 2018 and mid 2019 and 5,415 deaths.** This compares with 5,983 and 5,775 respectively for the previous one year period.
- Between mid 2018 and mid 2019, **the key driver of population change in Warwickshire was internal migration** (moves from within the UK) which increased from 78.2% in mid 2018 to 83.3%.
- The **contribution of natural change to population growth was slightly higher in this period** (7.3% in mid 2018 - 2019 compared to 3.2% in mid 2017 - 2018 ). This was largely due to fewer deaths in the period mid 2018 - 19.
- **International migration played a smaller part in population growth between mid 2018 and mid 2019** (8.9% ) compared with the previous period (14.9%)
