Work in partnership with schools and colleges to ensure children and young people, parents and carers know how to raise concerns about independent specialist schools and ask for a review when needs are no longer being met

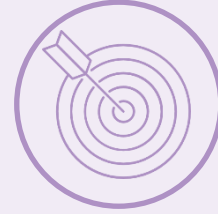


Request schools and colleges reflect on the survey and consider the areas children and families feel are important exploring:
