

CONSULTATION ON THE PROPOSAL TO ESTABLISH SPECIALIST RESOURCED PROVISION AT ST MATTHEW'S BLOXAM CE PRIMARY SCHOOL

Introduction

This consultation is being undertaken to advise you of proposals concerning St Matthew's Bloxam CE Primary School and to invite you to tell us what you think of the proposals. This is part of a statutory consultation process that Warwickshire County Council is managing in partnership with the Governing Body. The proposal is:

 To establish educational provision for children with special educational needs in the form of resourced (specialist) provision for up to 8 primary aged pupils with communication and interaction needs at St Matthew's Bloxam CE Primary School

Background

In order to meet forecast demand and build on the local offer of specialist provision the local authority is continuing the development of resourced provision across the county whereby pupils, who are able to access a mainstream curriculum, can have their needs met and benefit from being located within a mainstream school environment. The main growth and investment continues to be in specialist provision for pupils with communication and interaction needs and social, emotional and mental health (SEMH) difficulties. The demand for specialist educational provision is expected to continue to rise, with the level of demand anticipated to be highest in Nuneaton & Bedworth and Rugby.

In order to meet forecast demand and build on the local offer of specialist provision the local authority is continuing the development of resourced provision across the county whereby pupils, who are able to access a mainstream curriculum, can have their needs met and benefit from being located within a mainstream school environment.

There are currently 12 resourced provisions attached to mainstream primary provision in Warwickshire – 2 in North Warwickshire, 3 in Nuneaton & Bedworth, 3 in Rugby, 1 in Warwick and 3 in the Stratford on Avon area.

The Proposal

Warwickshire County Council is proposing to establish a specialist provision for up to 8 primary aged pupils, diagnosed with communication and interaction needs at St Matthew's Bloxam CE Primary. If approved, the provision would be implemented for September 2023.



St Matthew's Bloxam CE Primary School is a 1FE primary school, with an Ofsted rating of 'Good', with 210 places for children aged 4-11 years.

The specialist resourced provision at St Matthew's Bloxam CE Primary School will support pupils with an Education, Health and Care plan whose primary needs are communication and interaction. These pupils will benefit from accessing education at a mainstream primary school through a flexible approach, tailored and adapted to their needs.

The build proposal is to remodel a space previously used for early years provision, which is now located in a different part of the school, by creating a separate entrance to the specialist resourced provision with full height partition and new door with vision panel.

The outdoor play area will also be subdivided and upgraded with rubber matting and redecoration of the interior walls.

Admission and Pupil Numbers

The proposal is for the specialist resourced provision to cater for up to 8 pupils initially. This number may be reviewed in the future.

Admissions to the specialist resourced provision follow a different procedure from that operating for the rest of the school. Admissions into the specialist resourced provision will be through the Warwickshire County Council High Needs Provision Panel.

The establishment of the specialist resourced provision will not impact on the school's current total capacity of 210 across Reception to Year 6.

What is the proposed timetable?

- 27th April 2023: The County Council's Portfolio Holder for Education & Learning gave approval for the proposal to go out for consultation
- 9th May 6th June 2023: A 4-week consultation with parents and other interested stakeholders to take into account the views expressed regarding the proposals.
- 15th June 2023: If Cabinet agree to the proposals, the decision will be implemented during academic year 2023/24.
